Scholarship Information

Criteria:

- The applicant/recipient must be a member of the St. Andrews Society of the Inland Northwest or one of its affiliates. In the case of an applicant under age 18, at least one parent must be a member of the Society or one of its affiliates.
- Scholarships will be like financial assistance to members who want to improve their skills and knowledge in their area of interest in Scottish culture, for example, dancing, music, genealogy, history, or language.
- You may submit a scholarship request at any time during the year.
- The St. Andrews Society will give preference to applicants who, at the time of the award, do not intend to leave the Eastern Washington/Northern Idaho region and will be able to further the Scottish cultural life of our locale through the activities funded or promoted by the Society.
- The St. Andrews Society requires awardees to submit an article to the Society's newsletter, the Thistle Epistle, reporting their experiences and what they learned at the school, workshop, or seminar they attended.
- The St. Andrews Society will pay scholarship funds directly to the school, workshop, or seminar for tuition fees. If the applicant pays tuition before the St. Andrews Society awards a scholarship, the applicant may seek reimbursement by supplying proof of payment to the Scholarship Committee.
